22	Dr. O'Loughlin gave highlights on ADA Activities. She presented a video on the promotion of	
23	the ADA Find a Dentist Program and encouraged dentists to have their photograph taken at the	
24	booth on-site. She then presented the President's plaque and pin to Dr. D'Aiuto.

26	REPORT OF THE FDA PRESIDENT	
27	Dr. D'Aiuto began his presentation with the ADA membership video. He reflected on the first	
28	time he attended a House meeting in 1988. He emphasized the tripartite and the importance of	
29	working as a team. He then recognized each Component Executive Director and thanked them	
30	for their contribution to organized dentistry. He congratulated the FDA for its nomination for	
31	Association of the year from the Florida Society of Association Executives. He reported that,	
32	because of the FDA's membership efforts, the FDA has gained two delegate positions in the	
33	ADA House of Delegates. He mentioned working with the ADA to bring the national convention	on
34	to Florida in 2020. He announced the \$30,000 SPA grant to aid in educating Floridians about	
35	education and experience of mid-level providers. He thanked the Central Florida District Denta	1
36	Association and presented flowers to Ms. Janet Plourde.

TREASURER'S REPORT

- 2 Dr. Marshall presented the current financial position of the FDA. He explained that the reserve
- 3 account was lower due to the purchase of the new building. He reported that regular dues have
- 4 only gone up slightly in the last few years and the FDA's dues are lower than many states.
