#### 5 **UPDATE ON ADA ACTIVITIES**

- 6 Dr. Chad Gehani, President-elect, ADA, gave an update on ADA activities and thanked the
- 7 dentists of Florida for being so hospitable. He shared a video of ADA highlights of member
- 8 benefits and other statistics. He reported the ADA has secured a position of authority of health
- 9 care in the country and even though the landscape of dentistry is constantly changing, organized
- 10 dentistry must keep up. The success of the ADA Find-a-Dentist program exceeded expectations
- 11 and if the program is to continue, he said the ADA needs to hear from grassroots members. He
- 12 would also like energy directed to dealing with Direct to Consumer dentistry issues. Finally, he
- 13 asked the members to contact him at any time to voice their concerns. Dr. Gehani then presented
- 14 Dr. Paramore with the ADA Past President's pin.

#### 16 **TREASURER'S REPORT**
